Professor Fekri Hassan is Director of the Cultural Heritage Management Program at the French University in Egypt (Ph.D. Southern Methodist University, 1973). He taught at Washington State University (1975-1994) and held the chair of Sir Flinders Petrie in Archaeology at University College London (1994-2008). He served as archaeology advisor to the Minister of Culture Egypt (1988-1989), and as a senior consultant to the National Center for the Documentation of Cultural and Natural Heritage (CULTNAT, 2000-2001). He was Vice-President of "World Archaeology Congress" (1998-2002), and is co-founder and Honorary President of the UK "Egyptian Cultural Heritage Organization" (ECHO). Hassan has contributed more than two hundred and fifty publications in prehistoric archaeology, geoarchaeology, demographic archaeology, water history, archaeological theory and cultural heritage management. He edited "Strategic Approach to Egypt's Cultural Heritage" (2002), co-edited "Cultural Heritage and Development in the Arab World" (2008), and co-edits "Managing Egypt's Cultural Heritage" (Vol. 1 2009, Vol.2. 2015). Professor Hassan led and participated in **50 archaeological and geoarchaeological field expeditions**. He initiated Egypt's first project in heritage and Development for local communities in 2009 (The Dahshur World Heritage Site Mobilization for Cultural Heritage for Community Development 2009-2012), led with Prof. Caroline Rooney (U. Kent) a project on the Living Heritage of Historic Cairo (2015-2016), and is currently engaged with Jo Rowlands (U. Edinburgh) on a project for the valorization and conservation of Earliest Egypt.
